A rapid increase in global temperatures resulted, but as a result of the soot rising from the cataclysm, global temperatures again fell precipitously, eventually ushering in the Younger Dryas, a period of unstable rising and falling global temperatures. Then 12,300 years ago, a second cataclysmic event happened. A giant comet fragmented over the Northern Hemisphere destroying Lake Agassiz and causing massive flooding across America.
