Renaissance and Baroque Art Leo Steinberg, 2021-02 Leo Steinberg was one of the most original art historians of the twentieth century, known for taking interpretive risks that challenged the profession by overturning reigning orthodoxies. In essays and lectures ranging from old masters to contemporary art, he combined scholarly erudition with an eloquent prose that illuminated his subject and a credo that privileged the visual evidence of the image over the literature written about it. Four chapters are devoted to some of Velázquez's best-known paintings, ending with the famously enigmatic *Las Meninas*. *Renaissance and Baroque Art* is the third volume in a series that presents Steinberg's writings, selected and edited by his longtime associate Sheila Schwartz.

Images and Ideas in Seventeenth-Century Spanish Painting Jonathan Brown, 2022-02-08 Art historians have often minimized the variety and complexity of seventeenth-century Spanish painting by concentrating on individual artists and their works and by stressing discovery of new information rather than interpretation. Significant tendencies are analyzed in the case of Buddhism and Christianity. Eventually, a holistic view of symbolic communication and human culture emerges based on state-of-the-art in evolutionary biology, cognitive science, linguistics, and semiotics (philosophy of symbolic forms).
